



- HUMAN RIGHTS AND CHILDREN'S RIGHTS:
- YKI promotes Human rights and the UN conventions of the rights of the child.

- CHILDREN AND YOUTH:
- YKI believes that children and youth are competent and possess an inner capacity to develop and learn and that the periods of early childhood and youth lay the foundation of a better life.
- FAMILY EMPOWERMENT:
- YKI believes that the family is the basic unit of society and that the empowered family that knows its rights is an agent for change.
- COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT:
- YKI believes that the community has the potential to effectively reduce poverty through effective implementation of community development programmes such as of comprehensive Early Childhood Development (ECD), children, youth, and family programmes.
- ENVIRONMENTAL PRESERVATION:
- YKI believes that environmental preservation is essential and is more effective through collaboration with families, communities, governments, and organizations.
- LEADERSHIP TRAINING/TRAINING OF TRAINERS:
- YKI believes that leadership training is an effective and sustainable strategy for improvement of the life of children, youth and families.
- NETWORK:
- YKI networks with communities, educational institutions, public and private organizations.
- CAPACITY BUILDING:
- YKI believes in the expansion and capacity building of all the various actors in the civil society.

GUIDING PHILOSOPHY

- YKI works to strengthen families and people in the community so that they can participate in the development of children and youth. This is to be achieved by:
- Working "with" instead of "for" the community and by doing so strengthening their capacity for self-direction and self-reliance.
- Developing Resource Centres (RCs) as a vehicle to enlighten and empower the communities,
- Perceiving children and youth as competent with an innate ability to develop and learn, trying to understand their perspective and needs.
- Cooperating with, families, and the community, believing they have the inner potential to improve their life situation, influence social development and prevent poverty, segregation, and violence behaviour.
- Working with capacity development and support for parents, family, teachers, and leaders based on their needs, culture, desires, and interest.
- Working for democracy and human rights according to United Nations (UN) Convention of Human Rights, UN Convention for Children Rights and according to Agenda 2030

- Advocate and lobby for the United Nation (UN) Convention of Human Rights, UN Convention for Children's Rights and working and the UN Agenda 2030

- Empowering families to become agents for change.
- Development and production of standardized training materials.
- Engaging in Community based programmes for development.
- Capacity building of leaders and the establishment of Training of Trainers (TOT) programmes for various stakeholders.
- Networking and technical support.
- Promoting environmental issues and policies through direct contacts with governments, communities, public and private organizations., educational institutions, and individuals.
